SITUATION



- HQDA has declared August 2010 as Antiterrorism (AT) Awareness Month. Terrorism is an enduring, persistent, worldwide threat to our nation and to our Army Forces, AT is an integral part of Army efforts to defeat terrorism.



MISSION



- USAG Humphreys implements Antiterrorism training and education in support of Antiterrorism Awareness Month and initiates the iWatch ARMY program in a synergized effort to enhance the current level of Antiterrorism Awareness for Soldiers, Civilians and Family members and to leverage every member of the Army community as a sensor to help identify, prevent, and take an active role in reporting suspicious behavior and criminal activities.



Commander's Intent



- Instill and sustain heightened awareness and vigilance among leaders, Soldiers, civilians, and family members to prevent and protect the USAG Humphreys Army Community and critical resources from acts of terrorism.





What is iWatch?



- iWatch is a community program to help your neighborhood stay safe from terrorist activities
- iWatch is a program and partnership between your community and your local law enforcement
- iWatch asks you to report behavior and activities that are unusual or seem out of ordinary



Why Report Activities?



- It is your awareness report to local law enforcement that helps to predict and prevent attacks before they happen
- It is always better to report suspicious behaviors than refrain from doing so
- The iWatch ARMY program is about behaviors and activities, not individuals



What Activities to Report?



- People drawing or measuring important buildings
- Strangers asking questions about security procedures
- Suspicious packages left unattended
- Cars or trucks left in No Parking zones in front of important buildings
- Intruders found in secure areas
- Chemical smells or fumes that worry you
- A person wearing clothes that are bulky and/or too hot for the weather



What Activities to Report?



- Questions about sensitive information such as building blueprints, security plans or VIP travel schedules without a right or need to know
- Purchasing supplies or equipment that can be used to make bombs or weapons or purchasing uniforms without having the proper credentials
- Anything out of the ordinary daily activities you observe



Example Situations



- *“I saw someone taking pictures of the main gate. I don’t want to get them in trouble. What should I do?”*

Unsure? Let the experts decide!

- *“I saw someone watching our office, and the next day my co-worker was asked a lot of questions about our building by someone else.”*

Unsure? Let the experts decide!



Important Places to Watch



- Unit Headquarters
- Installation access points
- Sports/entertainment venues
- Recreation centers, fitness facilities
- Religious facilities
- Barracks, lodging facilities
- Large gatherings – parades, fairs, etc.
- Schools, libraries, day care centers
- Commissary, PX, gas stations, banks



What Should I Report?



1. Date and Time
2. Where it happened
3. What you witnesses
4. A description of who was involved

Male or female?

How tall?

Build?

Hair color, skin color, age?

English speaking or another language?

5. Was there a car? Note the license plate number.
6. Have you seen this activity in your area before?


