ARMY TESTS NEW WATER, FUEL BLADDERS

Army paratroopers completed two of three test drops Nov. 10 to certify a new water and fuel container system for airdrops in Afghanistan and elsewhere. Each drop of two Lifeline CUBEs delivered water safely to the ground under dual, 100-foot-wide parachutes from over 1,000 feet, according to the project lead, John Mahon of the U.S. Army Natick Soldier Research, Development and Engineering Center.
