



International Organization for Standardization Tactical Operations Center (ISO TOC)

What It Is:

For operations on any terrain, commanders and police forces can employ the new "command and control" platform known as the ISO Tactical Operations Center (ISO TOC).

Why It's Needed:

In a crisis, decision-makers need to respond immediately. To match the fast pace of modern warfare and terrorist operations, or the dire needs of a community in the midst of a natural disaster, command centers must be mobile and rapidly assembled—two demands met by the ISO TOC.

How It Works:

In its transport mode, this self-contained center measures only 8 × 8 × 20 feet. When it's deployed, the ISO TOC expands to provide about 400 square feet of open floor space.

Power, lights and network connectivity are built into the ISO TOC, allowing quick set-up times. When two or more ISO TOCs are interconnected physically and electronically, the result is a modular command and control complex that can be tailored to each mission.

Military users of the ISO TOC include the Theater High Altitude Area Defense (THAAD), Military Traffic Management Command, III Corp and 3rd Army.

Benefits:

Mobile...The ISO TOC can be transported by truck, rail, ship or plane.

Quick setup...The structure can be erected either on the transport truck or on the ground in less than 30 minutes and can be functional within an hour, depending on equipment and communications requirements.


Flexible...The ISO TOC can be set up on any terrain—wherever the coordination of manpower and resources is critical, such as disaster areas or battlefields.
